## CA Dream Act

## DACA

Where does it apply?

**California ONLY**

**Nationwide**

What it allows?

- ✓ allows undocumented students who meet the AB 540 requirements\* to apply for in-state tuition, state-administered financial aid, and apply and receive private scholarships

\*Graduate from a California high school or have attained the equivalent, GED-- certified by the State of California; attend a CA High School for 3 years or more (no need to be consecutive); attend a CA accredited post-secondary institution

- ✓ allows people who came to the United States as children and meet several guidelines may request consideration of deferred action for a period of two years, subject to renewal

- ✓ allows those who are eligible to have work authorization
- ✓ allows recipients to apply for a driver's license
